*Microsurgical Vasectomy Reversal*

## Fees & Payment Information

Vasectomy reversal is a cash-only surgical procedure. It is rarely if ever covered by insurance, and we are not contracted with any insurance carrier (or Medicare) and provide no billing services for insurance claims. Dr. Finnerty has worked with both the hospital and anesthesia to keep your costs as affordable and predictable as possible.

The fees for vasectomy reversal have 3 components: **surgeon's fee, outpatient surgery facility, and anesthesia services**. Current fees are as follows:

<b>Surgeon's Fee:</b>	<b>\$3200</b>
<b>Outpatient Surgery Center:</b>	<b>\$3735</b>
<b>Anesthesia Services:</b>	<b>\$975</b>

Two discounts are available: **Active duty military** are given a \$200 discount off the surgeon's fee: **\$3000**.

Patients who have had a prior unsuccessful reversal by Dr. Finnerty will be charged **\$1750** for a repeat reversal, should this be an appropriate option. Repeat reversal done by another surgeon will be charged full fee (**\$3200**) without additional charges.

Fees for the outpatient surgical center and anesthesiologist are not under Dr. Finnerty's control, but are set by these respective services based on their costs. They may therefore be subject to change without notice.

**Total cost** for the procedure is therefore is **\$7910** without discounts.

There is **no charge for consultation** by phone or Zoom.

**A down payment of \$500** is required to schedule surgery. This is applied toward the surgeon's fee once the procedure has been completed.

**All services must be paid in full 10 days prior to the procedure.** Failure to do so will result in cancellation of the procedure and loss of the deposit.

Procedures **may be cancelled** up until **1 week prior** to the scheduled date. **Cancellations after this time will result in loss of the down payment.**

Dr. Finnerty does not currently accept credit card payments or personal checks; bank checks or money orders are required. Online payment options including credit card payments and electronic bank transfers are currently under review.
